



Dr Scherman het in 2001 by die Fakulteit Opvoedkunde aangesluit, waar sy in 'n akademiese departement asook in die Sentrum vir Evaluasie en Assessering werk. Sy het 'n PhD in 2007 ontvang vir 'n proefskrif wat toegespits is op die verbetering van die gehalte van onderwys deur die gebruik van moniteringsisteme. Dr Scherman het 'n aantal beurse ontvang van die NNS en die Suid-Afrikaans-Nederlandse Navorsingsprogram vir Ontwikkingsalternatiewe (SANPAD).

Sy was verantwoordelik vir die opstel van etlike voorleggings vir befondsing as deel van haar werk vir die Sentrum vir Evaluering en Assessering in Opvoedkunde. In die Sentrum staan sy aan die hoof van die Navorsingsprogram oor Toegevoegde Waarde en is sy betrokke by 'n aantal ad hoc-navorsingsprojekte. Voortspruitend uit haar werk in die Fakulteit het sy twee onderrig-leertoekennings ontvang asook erkenning as 'n belowende navorser. Van haar publikasies het in nasionale en internasionale vaktydskrifte in die vakgebiede van skool-effektiwiteit en psigometrika verskyn. In 2008 het sy erkenning van haar eweknieë ontvang toe sy verkies is as Voorsitter van die Vereniging vir Evaluering en Assessering in Suider-Afrika (ASEASA). Sy het 'n Y2-gradering van die NNS.

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Dr Scherman joined the Faculty of Education in 2001, working both in an academic department and in the Centre for Evaluation and Assessment in Education. She obtained a PhD in 2007, focusing on improving the quality of education through the use of monitoring systems. Dr Scherman has obtained a number of grants, both from the NRF and the South Africa Netherlands Research Programme on Alternatives in Development (SANPAD).

She has been instrumental in writing a number of funding proposals as part of her work in the Centre for Evaluation and Assessment (CEA). In the CEA she leads the Value-added Research Programme and is involved in a number of ad hoc research projects. As a result of her work in the Faculty of Education, she has received two teaching and learning awards and is recognised as a promising researcher. She has published in national and international journals in the areas of school effectiveness and psychometrics. In 2008 she received recognition from her peers when she was voted Chairperson of the Association for Assessment and Evaluation in Southern Africa (ASEASA). She has a Y2-rating from the NRF.
