



Prof Prinsloo het sy vakkundige loopbaan in 1976 as Junior Lektor in Afrikatale aan die Universiteit van Pretoria begin. In 1979 ontvang hy die MA-graad met lof vir sy verhandeling oor "Lokatiefvorming in Noord-Sotho" en in 1984 word die graad DLitt et Phil vir sy proefskrif "Woordvolgorde en volgordeverandering in Noord-Sotho" deur die Universiteit van Suid-Afrika aan hom toegeken. In 1995 word hy bevorder tot Professor in die Department Afrikatale van die Universiteit van Pretoria en in 2000 word hy aangestel as Hoof van die Departement. In 2005 is hy as Voorsitter van die Skool vir Tale aan die Universiteit aangestel.

Prof Prinsloo het as konsultant vir die Pan-Suid-Afrikaanse Taalraad (PanSAT) opgetree om leiding aan die 11 nasionale leksikografie-eenhede te gee. Onlangs is hy deur die Nasionale Departement van Kuns en Kultuur aangestel as Linguïstiese Bestuurder van 'n multimiljoenrand-tekstverwerkingsprojek vir die amptelike Afrikatale van Suid-Afrika.

In 2000 het die Universiteit hom die eerste keer met die Uitnemende Akademiese Presteerder-medalje vereer, 'n toekening wat hy vir vyf opeenvolgende periodes van drie jaar ontvang het. In 2008 is hy verkies tot een van die Universiteit van Pretoria se Eeufeesdenkleiers. Hy het ook die 2010-PanSAT toekening ontvang vir effektiewe tegnologiese innovering ter bevordering van veeltaligheid. In die tydperk 2000 tot 2009 het hy navorsing bevorder as senaatsvertegenwoordiger vir die Sosiale en Geesteswetenskappe op die Senaatsnavorsingskomitee, as navorsingskoördineerder van die Skool vir Tale en as Voorsitter van die navorsingskomitee van die Fakulteit Geesteswetenskappe. Sy navorsing is toegespits op Sepedi-grammatika en op korpusgebaseerde leksikografie van Afrikatale.

Hy het meer as 'n 100 artikels en hoofstukke in akademiese boeke gepubliseer en 'n soortgelyke getal voorlesings aan konferensies gelewer. Hy is 'n stigterslid van die African Association for Lexicography (AFRILEX) en Redakteur van die ISI-geïndekseerde vaktydskrif *Lexikos* vir 2012.

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Prof Prinsloo started his professional career as a Junior Lecturer in African languages at UP in 1976 and received an MA (cum laude) for a dissertation on the formation of the locative in Northern Sotho in 1979, and a D. Litt. et Phil from the University of South Africa (Unisa) on word order and word order change in Northern Sotho in 1984. In 1995 he was promoted to Professor in the Department of African Languages at UP and in 2000 he was appointed as Head of the Department. Since 2005 he has been Chair of the School of Languages at UP.

He acted as a consultant for the Pan South African Language Board to guide the 11 National Lexicography Units and was recently appointed as the Linguistic Manager for a multimillion Rand text processing project for the official African languages of South Africa for the Department of Arts and Culture.

UP awarded him a medal as Exceptional Academic Achiever for the first time in 2000, an award he has received for five consecutive three-year periods. In 2008 he was chosen as one of the University of Pretoria Centenary Leading Minds. He also received the 2010 PanSALB Award for the Effective Innovation of Technology to Promote Multilingualism. In the period from 2000 to 2009 he promoted research in the University as Senate Representative for Humanities and Social Sciences faculties on the UP Senate Research Committee, as research coordinator of the School of Languages and as Chairperson of the Research Committee of the Faculty of Humanities. His research has been focused on Sepedi grammar and on corpus-based African language lexicography.

He has published more than 100 articles and chapters in scholarly books and has read an equal number of conference papers. He is a founder member of the African Association for Lexicography and Editor of the ISI indexed journal *Lexikos* for 2012.
