



Prof Vandeyar is Professor in die Departement Geesteswetenskaplike Opvoedkunde in die Fakulteit Opvoedkunde. Haar spesialisgebied omvat onderwys en diversiteit, onderwyserprofessionalisme en assesseringspraktyke. Sy stel veral belang in die implikasies van onderwyser- en studente-identiteite in die konstruksie van klaskameromgewings wat inklusief is wat betref ras, taal en etniese identiteit, en die bevordering van interkulturele onderwys wat die beginsels van maatskaplike geregtigheid beliggaam.

Prof Vandeyar het onlangs 'n toekenning van die Comparative International Education Society (CIES) ontvang vir die beste artikel in 2011 tot 2012, en die Mid-career (Teacher and Teacher Education)-toekenning vir 2011 van die American Education Research Association (AERA). Sy het ook die gesogte internasionale BMW-toekenning ontvang in die kategorie: Teorie (2006). Prof Vandeyar se werk is bekroon met die Navorsingspenning vir 2011 van die Opvoedkundevereniging van Suid-Afrika (EASA) en die Nasionale Wetenskap- en Tegnologieforum (NSTF) se 2007-toekenning in die kategorie Senior Swart Navorsers in die afgelope vyf tot tien jaar. In 2006 was sy 'n finalis in die onderwyskategorie vir die Shoprite Checkers/SABC2 Vrou van die Jaar-toekenning, is sy deur die Universiteit van Pretoria vereer as 'n Uitnemende Jong Navorsers en het sy ook twee gemeenskapstoekennings vir onderwys en navorsing ontvang. Sy is in 2009 genomineer vir die Social Justice Award van die American Educational Research Association (AERA). Die akademiese boek, *Diversity High: Class, color, culture and character in a South African high school*, waarvan sy en Jonathan D Jansen mede-outeurs was, is in 2009 genomineer vir die AERA Outstanding Book Award. Een van haar referate wat in die internasionale vaktydskrif *The International Journal of Educational Development* opgeneem is, is genomineer vir die Joyce Cain-toekenning (2009).

Sy is 'n aktiewe lid van AERA, CIES en die Opvoedkundevereniging van Suid-Afrika (EASA). Sy dien op die redaksies van verskeie plaaslike en internasionale vaktydskrifte en het die programrede gelewer by talle konferensies. Prof Vandeyar het 'n C2-gradering van die NNS.

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Prof Vandeyar is a Professor in the Department of Humanities Education in the Faculty of Education. Her specialist areas encompass education and diversity, teacher professionalism and assessment practices. She is particularly interested in the implications of teacher and student identities in constructing classrooms inclusive of racial, linguistic and ethnic identities and in promoting intercultural and social justice education.

Prof Vandeyar is a recent winner of the Comparative International Education Society (CIES) Best Article 2011–2012 Award and the American Education Research Association (AERA) Mid-career (Teacher and Teacher Education) Award, 2011. She received the prestigious international BMW Award in the category: Theory (2006). Prof Vandeyar's work was also awarded the Education Association of South Africa (EASA) Research Medal 2011, and the National Science and Technology Forum (NSTF) Award in 2007 in the category Senior Black Researcher over the past five to ten years. She was a finalist in the category Education of the Shoprite Checkers/SABC2 Woman of the Year Award in 2006, received an Exceptional Young Researcher's award from the University of Pretoria, and two community awards for education and research. She was nominated for the social justice award of the American Educational Research Association (AERA) in 2009. The scholarly book, *Diversity High: Class, color, culture and character in a South African high school*, which she co-authored with Jonathan D Jansen, was nominated for the AERA outstanding book award in 2009. One of her papers, published in an international journal, *The International Journal of Educational Development*, was nominated for the Joyce Cain award (2009).

She is an active member of AERA, CIES and the Education Association of South Africa (EASA). She serves on a number of editorial boards of international and national journals and has presented many invited keynote addresses. Prof Saloshna Vandeyar is an NRF C2-rated scientist.
