



Prof De Wet Swanepoel

Prof Swanepoel is medeprofessor in Oudiologie in die Departement Kommunikasiepatologie in die Fakulteit Geesteswetenskappe. Hy is 'n senior navorsingsgenoot by die Ear Science Institute Australia in Perth en beklee aanvullende posisies aan die Callier Center for Communication Disorders aan die University of Texas at Dallas, VSA, en aan die Ear Science Centre in die Skool vir Chirurgie van die Universiteit van Wes-Australië in Perth, Australië. Gehoorverlies is die mees algemene chroniese gestremdheid wat in die wêreld voorkom. Prof Swanepoel se navorsings- en kliniese belangstellings sluit die vroeëtydige identifisering en diagnose van gehoorverlies, objektiewe meting van gehoorfunksionering en telegesondheid van die oor en gehoor in. Sy navorsing is gerig op die verbetering van onderbedienende bevolkings se tydige toegang tot gehoorgesondheidsorg, en die verligting van die las van gehoorverlies op individue, gesinne en die samelewning. Sy werk het 'n groot invloed gehad op die bepaling van nasionale riglyne vir die vroeë identifisering van gehoorprobleme en vroeëtydige intervensie, soos voorgeskryf deur die Raad vir Gesondheidsberoeppe van Suid-Afrika.

Die Suid-Afrikaanse Vereniging van Oudioloë het prof Swanepoel erkenning gegee vir die beste akademiese en navorsingsbydrae tot audiologie. Hy het talle toekennings ontvang, waaronder 'n Presidentsgradering van die Nasionale Navorsingstigting. Hy is in 2011 verkies as stigterslid van die Suid-Afrikaanse Jong Akademie vir Wetenskap (SAYAS). Hy tree op as besoekende professor, onder meer aan die Universiteit van Wes-Australië in Perth en die Universiteit van Örebro in Swede. Prof Swanepoel is die outeur van meer as 70 portuurbeoordeelde artikels, boeke en hoofstukke in boeke. Hy is genooi om programredes aan te bied by verskeie internasionale konferensies en dien onder andere op die uitvoerende raad van die Internasionale Vereniging vir Oudiologie en die komitee belas met die ontwikkeling van 'n ICF-kernstel (ICF Core Set) vir Gehoorverlies binne die kader van die Wêreldgesondheidsorganisasie se internasionale klassifikasie van funksionering, gestremdheid en gesondheid (ICF). Hy dien as voorstuur vir die tele-audiologiekomitee van die Internasionale Vereniging vir Oudiologie en is medevoorsitter van die tele-audiologie-taakspan vir die Amerikaanse Akademie van Oudiologie. Hy is 'n mederedakteur van die *International Journal of Audiology* en die *International Journal of Health Science Education* en gasredakteur vir die *Journal of Speech Language and Hearing Research*.

Prof Swanepoel is an associate professor in Audiology in the Department of Communication Pathology in the Faculty of Humanities. He is also a senior research fellow at the Ear Science Institute Australia, Perth. He holds adjunct positions at the Callier Center for Communication Disorders, University of Texas at Dallas, United States, and at the Ear Science Centre, School of Surgery, University of Western Australia, Perth. Hearing loss is the most prevalent chronic disability. Prof Swanepoel's research and clinical interests span the field of early identification and diagnosis of hearing loss, objective measures of auditory functioning, and ear and hearing telehealth. His research interests are directed at improving timely access to hearing healthcare to underserved populations, and reducing the burden of hearing loss for individuals, families and society. His work has been influential in determining national guidelines for early hearing detection and intervention, as prescribed by the Health Professions Council of South Africa.

For his work, the South African Association for Audiologists awarded Prof Swanepoel for the best contribution to audiology in the field of academics and research. He has received numerous awards, including a President's rating from the National Research Foundation. In 2011, he was nominated as a founding member of the South African Young Academy of Science. He has been invited as visiting professor to international institutions, including the University of Western Australia, Perth, and the University of Örebro in Sweden for extended periods of time. Prof Swanepoel has published more than 70 peer-reviewed articles, books and book chapters. He has been invited to deliver keynote presentations at several international conferences and serves on the executive board of the International Society of Audiology and the World Health Organisation International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (ICF) Core Set for Hearing Loss committee, among others. He chairs the tele-audiology committee for the International Society of Audiology and co-chairs the tele-audiology taskforce for the American Academy of Audiology. He serves as associate editor for the *International Journal of Audiology* and the *International Journal of Health Science Education* and as a guest editor for the *Journal of Speech Language and Hearing Research*.
