Module content

This module will provide students with detailed knowledge and understanding of the underlying policy and diverse provisions of the Competition Act 89 of 1998 (as amended) as well as practical guidance on the application thereof. The following aspects will be dealt with within the context of international comparative competition law:

- a. Introduction to competition policy, jurisdiction and the structure of competition authorities
- b. Economics of competition law
- c. Relevant aspects of markets and market power
- d. Horizontal agreements and restrictive horizontal practices
- e. Vertical agreements and restrictive vertical practices
- f. Abuse of dominance
- g. The Competition Act and price setting
- h. Exemption applications
- i. Merger assessment
- j. Merger regulation: legal and procedural aspects

University of Pretoria Programme Qualification Mix (PQM) verification project

The higher education sector has undergone an extensive alignment to the Higher Education Qualification Sub-Framework (HEQSF) across all institutions in South Africa. In order to comply with the HEQSF, all institutions are legally required to participate in a national initiative led by regulatory bodies such as the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET), the Council on Higher Education (CHE), and the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA).
